What did we hear?





Emerging 'Big Things' we heard the community wants prioritized through the High Point 2045 planning process:



There is a north/south divide that creates what feels like two or more different cities.



The vitality and sense-ofplace of Downtown must be improved.



Walkability/bikeability options are insufficient in many areas of the City.



Access to grocery stores and medical facilities is a real challenge for residents without access to cars.



Mixed-use development should be considered for key areas throughout the City.
